We have had a super couple of weeks in Duck class as our duck eggs arrived. It was amazing to watch our first duckling hatch out of the egg, the children were

so excited. We then had so much fun holding the ducklings, taking them for walks and giving them swimming time! The children were great at looking after the ducklings and making sure they had enough food and water. We loved the experience and learnt so much!

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Year 3 have been learning about Ancient Egypt for their history topic. We learnt all about mummification and analysed the artefacts that were found with the mummy. We also learnt about the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb, including interviewing a number of eyewitnesses to the events, and used what we discovered to write a newspaper report about.

In science we have been learning all about light and shadow, and have enjoyed

doing experiments in reflection and making shadows.

OOK AT WHAT WE ARE LEARNING

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Throughout May, Year 1 have been exploring space further! We have learnt all about Neil Armstrong, Helen Sharman and Mae Jemison and the amazing contributions they made to space exploration. We read one of our favourite Year 1 books, Look Up by Nathan Bryon and made colourful posters to advertise our own meteor showers. In D&T we have been designing our own hand puppets that we will be making and sewing this week. One of the most exciting parts of this half-term has been starting our Young Leaders Award that focuses on our 4 Clifford Values; kindness, action, teamwork and perseverance. We are recording all the fantastic things we do to show these values daily!

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In year 4, we have been learning about the Romans as part of our history topic and enjoyed a virtual Roman workshop in the hall. We learnt about life during the Roman period and got to see some replica artefacts and found out more about the timeline of the historical events.

In RE, we have been learning about the Buddhist faith and have been considering the question 'Could the Buddha's teachings make the world a better place? As part of our learning, we visited the Kampala Buddhist Centre and took part in a meditation, we also got to see some of the different Buddha statues and

learn more about Enlightenment.

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We have studied pattern in art this half term in Y5, we have looked at how Escher used tessellation and repetition for effect. The children created card templates and inspired by animal forms, developed their own abstract repeating designs. We also investigated patterns using nature at Ecclesall


